•Agenda approved by Zhong. All voted. Passed.

•Introduction of Principal and Vice Principal.

•Introduction of 2013-2014 Year End Report.

•we have switched to an elecronic newsletter. No more paper. This is how council will communicate. Infromation will also be available through school website and teacher blogs and Facebook. This is much more cost efficient. Also, telephone system is available.

•Pita Pit lunches have been added as an option.

•There was increased fundraising last year but will still need more this year. Computer labs are going away and not being replaced. Classes will be moving toward tablets.

•WEJ has a parent resource library thanks to a \$1000 Parents Reaching Out Grant. Parents are encouraged to take advantage of the materials. However, there a "check out" system has not yet been established.

•We would like to have more family events. But it should be noted that these are usually attended by grades 3 and under.

•Treasurer, Maggie, provided itemized financial report for last year. Looks successful. We came out a bit ahead. It should be noted that all funds raised must be used within the calendar year. And final approval of spending by the council is given by the principal.

•Hot lunches online order system put into place at a cost but is much more efficient.

•There is no cap for the amount of funds that can be raised. There are specific rules and regulations on the school council website that outline proper spending. We have a "non profit" account set up through TD.

•Concern raised about recycling material from milk program. Kindergartners' coming home with messy backpacks. Parents feel that they should have been made aware that recycling will come home.

•We are hoping to move toward having one interface for all fundraising items or items at a cost; milk, pizza, juice and all other fundraising.

•Concern expressed over hot lunches not being made available to the Kindergartners'. This was put to a vote last year - "A resounding NO."

•Hot lunch will possibly be extended to 3 days a week depending on provider. It can be quiet expensive.

•Council is looking for a few parent volunteers to coordinate Pita & Pizza distribution. There is a sign-up sheet. Someone also had the idea to sell any leftovers to staff to eliminate waste. This will also depend on a distribution volunteer. •WEJ will be switching from Pizza Pizza to Jo-Jo's because it has a more direct classroom delivery system. Easier distribution and more hygienic.

•Motion proposed to use Jo-Jo's for a term. Seconded. None opposed.

•Motion proposed for price of pizza slice. \$2.25. A few parents mentioned wanting a possible discount for multiple children. We didn't vote.

•WEJ hats to be sold at BBQ. These are leftover's from last year. Pure profit.

•Lonestar night will be set up again. Very easy fundraising. Go eat on a certain night and 10% goes back to WEJ.

•PRO. Parents Reaching Out. We were approved for a grant for "code for kids." Parents and students will work together to learn programming. Considering grades 4-6.

•October 2 - Meet the Teacher BBQ. We will be using grillmaster. No cost to WEJ. Volunteers will be needed to sell tickets and food. Sign up sheet provided.

•Movie Night. Licensed by ACF to show movies for "free." Maleficent was suggested for the first movie but was thought a bit too mature. There is a website called "common Sense Media" that rates movies based on age.

•Our trustee is Christine Boothby. Recently acclaimed. She has nothing to report at this time regarding Boundary Review.

•WEJ has late bell time. Trustee raised point of fee for before school care. There is currently no difference in fee no matter drop-off time. This may change. It is noted that bell time cannot be changed due to bus schedules.

•Middle French Immersion program is through Grade 7. Grade 4 Immersion program is quiet crowde at this time.

•October 16 is photo day. Family portraits will be offered after school from the photographer.

•EQAO. Standardized tests for Grades 3 and 6. They are tested on reading, writing and math. Results are public and were just released.

Grade 3 reading - 88% writing - 88% math - 92%

Grade 6 reading - 97% writing - 97% math - 84%

Great scores but province-wide there will be a push to increase math scores. School learning plan is to boost our scores. Although they are high, they could be better.

•Concern expressed over split classes. (JK & SK) Principal says that depending on the program (English vs. Immersion) this is the reality and the children actually seem to benefit from the mix.

Principal's Report School Council Meeting Tuesday, September 23, 2014

This school year we have 31 homerooms, with a present enrolment of 692 students. Total staff is 62. We have 11 school buses this year and 5 vans.

We are into our fifth year with the Full Day Early Learning Kindergarten program and extended day program.

The Middle French Immersion program expanded to Grade 7 this year. We had an increase in enrolment at the Grade 4 level at the end of the school year and on our return. The Board has advised that we are getting another grade 4 MFI teacher.

The Terry Fox Walk/Run takes place this Wednesday afternoon. Feel free to come out and join us for the last period of the day. Looks like good weather.

We are holding a fire drill practices this week and next week.

Our primary and grades 4 and 5 classes will be going to the Carp Fair this Friday.

Meet the Teacher and BBQ sponsored by the School Council is Thursday October $2^{nd} 4:30 - 6:00 \text{ p.m.}$

Friday October 10 is a PA Day and Monday October 13 is Thanksgiving.

Students are practicing for Cross Country. The junior Meet is scheduled to take place Oct. 17 and the Intermediate Meet is October 15.

Photo Day is October 16th. Students' pictures will be taken during the day. The photographer will stay on after the end of the school day to take family photographs.

EQAO (Education Quality and Accountability Office) has provided us with the results of the 2012-13 Assessments of Reading, Writing and Mathematics and they are now public.

Students in Grade 3 and 6 write these province wide tests at the end of the school year. Individual student results will be sent home shortly.
