#### **Update on Activities of Council**

#### International Walk to School Day

Jennifer Ljungstrom updated on International Walk to School Day. More than 650 juice boxes handed out to participating students. Thanks for all volunteers' help to make it successful.

## Pizza Lunch

## **Inter-School Council Update**

Megan Cornell gave an update on Inter-School Council

Megan attended Kanata South/North meeting the week before. On the meeting it was mentioned School Board has two Committee of the Whole meetings per month, plus a full Council meeting once a month. Parents can find agendas for meetings online and can attend in person and make representations on issues.

#### Boundary Review

Starting in December, school board will review school boundary for Kanata North. There is a possibility to build a new school in Kanata Tech area.

The 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade transition to Earl of March is underway. School assets will be proportionally transferred. Ear-marked funds will not be affected.

## Transportation

Bus related transportation hazards to be brought to school attention. Snowplowing at bus stops is to be coordinated with city. Parents are encouraged to raise questions if any.

## Earl of March Expansion Update

Joanne Irwin highlighted on Earl of March Expansion.

The addition for Grade 7 and 8<sup>th</sup> students will be built at the south end of current Earl of March school building along Campeau Drive. There will be a communication meeting to be held at Earl of March on Oct. 30<sup>th</sup> Wed. at 7pm. Parents are encouraged to attend the meeting to get more detailed knowledge of plan.

Plan to be submitted to ministry in Nov. If approved, construction will start in spring of 2014. Targeted date to finish is summer of 2015. School will receive its first students in September 2015.

Music room funding is still pending. If it is not approved, there is alternative design but it will affect the use of other classrooms.

## **Events Committee Update**

Megan had spoken on the Events Committee:

## Movie Night

It is scheduled for late Nov. Licensing to be approved. Children are to be accompanied by parents.

## Winter Celebration

Committee is considering having an evening of music and fun for kids as well as parents. Date and format are to be discussed.

## Family Dance

Committee suggested holding a family dance in Feb. Date to be announced.

## BBQ

Committee suggested having a BBQ event in May. Funding and actual date are to be determined.

## **Fundraising Priorities and Ideas**

Megan (or Brian both) updated on fundraising.

Fundraising Committee has yet to be formed. Council had distributed Input Requests to teachers for funding project ideas. Council will work with school to prioritize allocation of raised fund.

Projects suggested:

Paint in the Gym behind stage

IPads with Apps Smart Boards for classrooms Outdoor music instruments

While prioritizing fund allocation, Council needs to know more about school technology use across the Board. Tech policy for WEJ is to be discussed by parents.

Other fund raising ideas:

Seek computer donated from outside Grocery store partnership

Alternative Lunch Program

Brian spoke about parents' interest on alternative lunch programs. Options to be considered:

Lunch Lady Pizza: Additional of current once a week Pita Ouiznos

Council will evaluate cost to parents, volunteer coordination request and fund raising value to determine if new lunch program be added.

Last council meeting, parents had shown interest to extend pizza program to Kindergarten class. Feedback from kindergarten classroom teachers is not to have it.

#### **Treasure's Report**

Co-signing of new chairs has yet to be updated. Brian and Megan will contact the bank to have it done.

\$500 grant for Parental Involvement and \$1000 grant Parent Reaching Out will be received soon. Per past year experiences, they were received around this time of the year.

Past year council raised fund (Pizza and Milk/Juice) were managed by the school. This year, council is looking into policy for allocation.

## **Principle's Update**

Principle Marilyn Burans thanked those attended the meeting.

Terry Fox Walk September 26 was very successful.

Primary and junior students enjoyed Carp Fair Field Trip on September 27<sup>th</sup>.

Photo Day October 17<sup>th</sup> went off very well. Possible spring session if enough requests within school and would arrange for family photo opportunity at next year's photo day after school.

There have been a number of extra curricular activities: Cross Country, Football, Soccer, Band, Gr.8s attended World of Work Workshops at the Ernst and Young Conference Centre; Gr.5&6 English visited Museum of Nature.

PA day October 11<sup>th</sup> staff worked on School Improvement Plan for Student Achievement (SIPSA). Focus was Numeracy. Discussion on EQAO results was also part of the PA day. Staff discussed writing could be the focus for next SIP.

There will be a number of spooktacular activities planned on October 31.

Elementary Progress Report will be going home Thursday November 7<sup>th</sup>. Parent Teacher interviews will be on Thursday November 14<sup>th</sup> and Friday November 15<sup>th</sup>. Some Kindergarten interviews will be scheduled on other days to accommodate the number of students in FDK. On line interview scheduling will be continued this year.

## School Fund Raising

Current programs are pizza lunch and milk/juice programs. WEJ's prices on these items are within the range in comparison to other schools. Fund generated from the two programs go into the School Generated Fund and reported on by the Principle at SC meetings. This year generated fund will be directed to technology, in school presentations/workshops, reading resources and to assist students in need.

On Remembrance Day, Monday November 11<sup>th</sup>, Gr. 7 & 8 students will be participating in the Remembrance Day Ceremony and Parade in Village Green Memorial Park. Gr. 1 to 6 students will attend Remembrance Day assembly in the school gym in the morning. Parents are invited to attend. Kindergarten students will remember with a short activity in the Library.
