• **Science Mobile-Community Event** - Laura works for Canadian Electricity Association (CEA), a not-for-profit association that acts as the national voice for safe, secure and sustainable electricity, promoting it as a key social, economic and environmental enabler that is essential to Canada's prosperity. Their annual National Electricity Month takes place in June and this year they are planning community events that reinforce the importance of electricity in our daily lives through educating, inspiring, and creating excitement around electricity and electricity sources! One of the events they are considering is a friendly internal competition between area schools that CEA's children attend - promoting leaders in energy conservation! - 4. Ability to distribute and obtain any clearances or permissions required by the school or school board.
 - The school needs to respond by April 25th, 2017 to be eligible. Mrs. Burans thought it would be a really great program, however space is an issue right now since the gym will be under renovation. She will speak with the teachers and look into it and get back to Laura.
